A Word from one of our Ministers

Dear Friends,

I am not sure whether it was just some accident or some greater design that set me on the journey of making the recent

statements I have made about Inclusivity in my more recent pulpit ministry. I have a hunch that there is more to it than just some quirk of fate.

By the time some of you will get to read this we will have held the first of our three days in our Discerning Prayer Journey that is unfolding over these three months, May, June and July. Just to remind you the dates are: 12:30pm, 26th May at London Road, 12:30pm, 7th June at Partridge Green and 12:30pm, 4th August at St Andrew's. They're all after Church on a Sunday and you're invited to bring your own lunch with tea and coffee provided.

What has this to do with that, you may be asking.

Well, despite the fact that we have made some really significant decisions about inclusivity, there is no explicit statement regarding being inclusive in our mission and vision statement! It's all rather implicit. Both Sarah and I think we need to ensure that, as we go through this Discerning Prayer Journey process, we don't lose sight of that and ensure that a more explicit statement about our commitment to being an inclusive church finds a place in our vision and mission statement.

Where do we begin to think about inclusivity?

Let me offer two thoughts, one from Scripture and one from the Creeds, and make some general affirmations and end with a specific call.

The Creation story is so much more than simply a mechanistic explanation of *HOW* the world was made and by *WHOM*. Fundamentally it tells us that creation exists because God *IS*. The whole of creation is an expression of God's being, nature and purpose and it should remind us that everything bears that stamp, everything!

When God says: 'Let us make humankind in our image, in our likeness' Gen 1:26 it gets a little bent out of shape because it seems to imply that we're the only ones who bear that image and likeness. I think that is the whole human story in microcosm, just there! Remember who wrote the story! No! More than just you and me, the whole of creation bears the image and likeness of the Creator. The fundamental fact is that we *ALL* belong together!

The Nicene Creed, in its opening statement, says: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of *ALL* that *IS*, seen and unseen. Ponder that for a moment. Creator of ALL that IS. If it exists, it exists because GOD made it so! Now I know that is a radical thought so I'm not going to have an argument with you over it – believe me, I have had enough of those with myself – but every time I am brought back to that fundamental truth and I have to start from there.

Where does that leave us?

Well, actually, there is a great deal of good work already in place. We have taken steps to make our chapels accessible. We all have accessible entrances, toilets, flexible seating. There are hearing loops in all three chapels and we are constantly trying to better shape our presentations so they are legible and accessible. But what of our language, what about our unconscious bias – those habits and norms that are so much part of who we are that we almost don't notice them but they show when we meet the stranger or the other? There is work we need to do and somehow, we need to incorporate that into our conversation over these next few months.

There is, however, one specific thing I want to invite your participation in. In response to my sermon on Peter & Cornelius someone asked me: 'So what are you doing about it?!' It took more than a small measure of self control not to point out that actually, this is NOT about me, or Sarah for that matter. This is about US. WE need to do something, particularly about the decision we have made at London Road and St Andrew's to be specifically inclusive regarding the breadth of human sexuality. Both those chapels, along with Sarah and myself, are registered for celebrating the marriage of any two people. We all thought that was an amazing decision, and it is, but for the most part, no-one else knows! Well, I hope, that is about to change. Horsham is about to enter into the Gay Pride movement and our first Pride event is set to take place on Friday 28th June and WE'RE GOING TO BE THERE! We have reserved a stall and now we need you to join in with helping us to staff the stall throughout the day.

In preparation for this event we will be meeting with a Gay colleague in the neighbouring Circuit to help us appreciate the etiquette and the opportunity that has been set before us. Please can you let Lindsey know in the Church office on **office@cornerstone-mc.org** or 01403-240714 if you would like to be a part of this team. Our meeting with Gill Baalham has yet to be set so please watch the Weekly Mailing and Notices for that information. I look forward to taking this step into the glorious unknown of a new adventure in faith and discipleship with you.

METHODIST WORLD MISSION MEXICO

FREE METHODIST WORLD MISSIONS

In December 2023 Rev. Holly Adams, who is one of the officers in the Connexional Team, visited the Methodist Churches in Mexica Methodist Church held their first service on

since the Mexican Methodist Church held their first service on Christmas Day 1873.

In 1825 a group of Cornish tin miners arrived after a 3000-mile journey to work in Mexico's silver mines. They were members of the Methodist Church and joining missionaries from the USA, began to spread the Wesleyan tradition in Mexico.

Throughout these anniversary celebrations Rev. Adams reflected on things God might also be saying to our churches in the UK. She writes about 5 of these in her report.

Lesson 1. Participate in the "bigness" of Connexion. She recognised the deep privilege of belonging to the Global Methodist family as on a Sunday she worshipped in a small city church that meets in an old factory building and was told by one of the members "a piece of your heart stays here with us ". On other occasions she met alongside representatives from the UMC of Latin America and the 6 conferences in Mexico. Bishop Juan de Dios Pena from El Salvador reminded them "we are all in a time of transition and in order to survive we will need stronger Connexionalism".

For us in the UK who meet in small local churches we need to remember the value of meeting together with others in our circuits and districts to worship and learn of the "bigness" of our shared faith in God's greatness.

Lesson 2. Operate from a place of faithfulness, not fear. Congregational decline is a concern to many of Mexico's Church Leaders and they ask themselves if their ministry is no longer relevant to our society. This question is painful. "Will the Church still be there for our Grandchildren?" Rev. Adams remembers the leader saying "All we can do is focus on being faithful. We need not worry about the next 150 years. It is through faithfulness that we will find relevancy. She quotes the prayer written to commemorate the martyrdom of Oscar Romero, "We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the Master Builder and the workers, ministers not messiahs, prophets of a future not our own."

Lesson 3. Revival has an "I" in it not a "U". During lectures dealing with Global concerns the speaker spoke about Conversion as when "divinity shows up and changes us" which resonated with Rev. Adams as she recalled the words included in

the "Evangelism and Growth" sector for the UK Methodist church – "transformation happens (only) through encounter with the living God". She asks how this experience might bring changes in our own lives and in our Churches today, by humbly asking God to revive us individually.

Lesson 4. Our comfort zones need stretching. Not an easy concept for our ageing membership. This Anniversary Conference was not meant to be a "pat on the back" for past successes but a bold challenge to step into the future to face the issues that will stretch our commitment and to hear God's call to engage in His mission as He unfolds the future. For example, two ordained female Pastors of the Methodist Church sat at the front during the conference with all the Bishops of the District. This recognition of the role women need to play in the future is a courageous move for the Mexican Church and a visible symbol that they are ready to stretch their comfort zone.

Lesson 5. Participate in the "smallness" of relationship. The "bigness" of Connexionalism is formed by many inter-connected individual relationships. Some Christians may prefer a bigger more charismatic church for Sunday worship but often return to a smaller church when they need help or comfort because we have time for them 24/7, following the example of Jesus during His earthly ministry. Rev. Adams asks, "So how might we seek nothing bigger than building meaningful relationships with people inside and outside the Church and make this our sole aim?" She concludes, these are not new ideas, but they are still relevant to the church in the UK and in Mexico and we have much to share as we walk together into the future.

Our partnership in prayer is a mutual encouragement as we join them on 14th day of each month. Their neighbouring District is Belize and Honduras, where our Mission Partners, Rev. Chris and Linda Haines lead the work of the Methodist Schools and Churches. They lead us in prayer on day 11 each month. This prayer gives us a glimpse of their busy lives and their newsletters give very detailed reports and can be seen on the MWM website along with some of Chris's excellent photography. Their current home is Utila on one of the islands in the bay off the coast of Honduras . They request prayers for their church members where they foster discipleship and develop Leadership to prepare for ministry and responsibility, aiming to reach out into their communities with God's love. The Methodist School is bi-lingual (English and Spanish) and also focuses on preparing students to be followers of Jesus. Rev. Haines also supports the wider network of the Methodist Church in the Caribbean, mostly by Zoom meetings.


