A Word from one of our Ministers

Friends,

Driving around this past weekend, for the stationing visit, I have twice enjoyed driving a particular stretch of road around Dorking where there is a glorious tunnel of autumnal trees on a hill close to the golf course: I'm sure that many of you will know it too. The rich brown leaves are forming layers on the ground and the magnificent hues still on the trees are just beautiful in the sunlight. Autumn is in its full glory.

Autumn is a beautiful time of year, but it is a time of change, a time when we must let go of the heat of the sun and embrace the winter chill – it helps if we have warm homes and good food in order to endure that, but there is no getting away from autumn as a time of change. We can't keep the leaves on the trees however hard we wish or try. But the dropping of the leaves makes room for the fresh growth of spring: our God is a creator God and we are made in God's image, so we are creators too – and we are called to enter into creation alongside God, each in our own way, however big or small. The deep roots of the trees enable them to survive the winter and live again into the spring. Our own rootedness in God is what will enable us to live through these times of transition and to bloom again in the spring.

We are in the midst now of the third round of "Your Place at the Table" conversations, and we have had some great opportunities to share and to listen to one another – were you there? In the last round we particularly thought about the President's call on the Church to "Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed." (Isaiah 1.17a) and we explored the national call to be a "growing, inclusive, evangelistic, justice-seeking church" which opened up some helpful conversations.

In this season of Church life, there may be some things which are falling away, just as the leaves are falling now: remember though that those leaves enrich the soil and encourage and support the new growth, so nothing is ever truly lost, but just built upon again and again. By deepening our roots, we will be able to grow into the next season with strong shoots. As we follow the Lectionary readings year after year, and they take us through the pattern of Jesus' life, it might be tempting to just go with that flow but there is a constant invitation to go deeper each time, to encounter God afresh and in new and different ways with each trip around the sun, and with each journey through the Son's life with us. As we enter Advent now, there is an opportunity to go deeper, to consider more, to draw closer. I pray that this Advent and Christmas is a precious time of encounter and discipleship afresh for us all.

This year our Advent and Christmas services at Cornerstone will be using resources from the



The team is made up of 10 members from Cornerstone Methodist Church, Holy Trinity CofE and St Marks CofE and we hope to be able to lead worship at least twice a term. This time, to fit in with the school's theme of God's Promises - The Helper, we presented a story entitled 'Goodbye at last' which included Jesus telling his disciples "And if you ever feel scared or alone, don't worry. Just talk to me, and I'll be with you. I promise." The story also foretells the coming of the Holy Spirit, the continuing presence of which was discussed with the children and celebrated in our closing prayer. We enjoy presenting God's word to the children in this dramatised form which brings the stories from the Bible to life for them.

The picture shows members of the team, in costume with some of our props from the story. We hope to return to All Saints in early December when we have been asked to prepare an assembly based on the visit of the shepherds to baby Jesus.

Homeless in Horsham



How do you feel when you see someone sitting on the street and homeless in Horsham? Being homeless carries a certain stigma, doesn't it? We may wonder how the individual came to be in a pickle like that. Or perhaps it is their lifestyle choice.

Like John 1, for instance. He is easily recognised by his big black, bushy beard. John turns up in Horsham a couple of times a year, sits in the Carfax and feeds the pigeons. Then he gets a E2 bus ticket and tours the Sussex coastline. He has little family contact, shuns controlling society, and refuses to conform. After his bus trip, he hitchhikes to Yorkshire and tours around there. His lifestyle is his choice.

When we came to Horsham, I met Gary 1. Some time ago, Gary's wife died in tragic circumstances. It really unhinged him. He lost his wife. He lost his way, his job and his home. He became a street sleeper. Gary 1 has addictions and some months ago, attempted suicide. I last saw him one night recently, sitting on the pavement in the Oaklands area of Horsham looking pretty glum. He had a pair of crutches beside him. A storm was breaking so we ate fish and chips in my car and talked. He said he'd been beaten up twice in Horsham, and was hospitalised as a result. After our chat, he asked me to drive him to a local covered car park where he spent the night together with his street sleeping mates.

Then I met Mario 1, who arrived a year ago illegally from Romania, without papers or passport, conned by traffickers with the promise of a job that didn't exist. He sits and begs in the underpass and is in limbo, waiting for the authorities to determine his future.

This snapshot of homeless life in Horsham is of course, mirrored across the country. What most homeless people want is stability, a sense of self-worth, and somewhere to belong. Here in Horsham, we are blessed with Turning Tides and the Salvation Army, who do a magnificent job helping and giving temporary accommodation to many homeless people. However, they cannot meet everyone's needs. We can help.

Perhaps when next you see someone homeless, could you greet them with a smile, a handshake, and ask them their story? You could mention you are from Cornerstone Methodist Church and that God loves them. Maybe, offer to buy them a coffee and mince pie or drop some coins in their cup. You may have a spare blanket to give them.

If you do any of these things, you will be helping to make a homeless stranger's day a whole lot brighter.

World Religion Day January 19th 2025

World Religion Day is celebrated every year on the third Sunday of January. The aim is to promote understanding and peace between all religions, encouraging people to learn about other faiths and their followers.

It was originally started by the Baha'i faith in 1950 which says that all religions have common features and should be respected equally. They believe there is one God who is known by different names in all religions. The Baha'i faith believes that all humans are born equal and we all have equal rights regardless of our faith.

For centuries different faiths and religions have fought each other and World Religion Day aims to promote unity in order to overcome historical differences.

There are six major religions in the world today and nearly 75% on the world practices one of these.

In order of popularity they are Christianity, Buddhism, Islam, Hinduism, Judaism and Sikhism.

Each of these religions encourage kindness to others:

Christianity – In everything you do, do to others as you would have them do to you. Buddhism – Hurt not others in ways that you yourself would find hurtful.

Islam - Not one of you truly believes until you wish for others what you wish for yourself.

Hinduism – This is the sum of duty – do not do to others what would cause pain if done to you.

Judaism – What is hateful to you do not do to your neighbour.
